



International Student Breakdown

International Students



As of 2023, marginalised groups were 34% more likely to be food insecure

In 2021, 74.5% of international students were experiencing a form of food insecurity

♦ 90% of food bank users in four different ontario schools were international students

Over 1200 international students from 74 countries in Fredericton area





Barriers and Factors causing Food Insecurity



- ★ Access to culturally relevant food
- **★** Inflation
- ★ Housing Crisis
- ★ Tuition costs
- ★ Exposure to prejudice
- ★ Fear of stigma
- ★ Limited cooking skills and knowledge of canadian food
- ★ Limited time to prepare meals



General Resources and Concerns for International Students



- Recruiters need to be held accountable to properly educate Students before bringing theme to Canada
- ☐ Federal and Provincial governments need to work alongside post secondary institutions to ensure the needs of international students are met

Resources being offered across different post secondary institutions:

- > Emergency food pick up programs
- ➤ Letting International student pick out food bank items to ensure culturally relevant food
